



## AVOID WITHDRAWAL RISKS – REQUEST FOR FURTHER EXAMINATION

### Ensuring Compliance in Patent Applications

In the patent registration process, completeness of documents and adherence to regulations are crucial. Any deficiencies or failure to meet formal requirements may lead to the withdrawal of your patent application by the Directorate General of Intellectual Property (DGIP).

If your application is deemed withdrawn, you will receive a **Notification of Deemed Withdrawal** from DGIP, confirming that your application will no longer proceed.

If you wish to continue the examination process, you must file a **Request for Further Examination** within six (6) months from the date of the notification. This process, previously known as **Reconsideration**, allows you to rectify any outstanding issues and move forward with the application.

Additionally, you will be required to pay an extra fee amounting to **50% of the initial filing fee**. Upon submission, the **Formalities Section** of DGIP will review your request and determine whether the examination may continue.
